school	If your state requires it, find a cover school/umbrella school. If required, be sure to apply to one and check here when the paperwork is done and your local board has been notified of your intent to homeschool. Some don't accept enrollment mid-year for those starting in the middle of the school year. If you're going to start
	chooling next school year, enrollment usually starts in the summer. It may be a couple months before you can check this , depending on where you are in your year/planning stage. Decide if a co-op is right for you.
your k	Decide when you want to start homeschooling and pick a date to un-enroll kids from public school. Decide if you need to do some "de-schooling". Use the bubble to brainstorm some "de-schooling" ideas. Zoo or museum trip, nature walk at the park/picnic day. Topics that interest your child that you can research at the library together.
